DECLARATION OF RECISSION EMERGENCY SLOW-NO-WAKE ZONES ON SQUAW BAY

Heavy rainfall in June resulted in high water levels on Lake Monona posing a substantial risk to property and public safety. On July 5, 2013, an Emergency Slow-No-Wake Zone was declared on Squaw Bay on Lake Monona. The emergency slow-no-wake zone was declared by the County Executive, Sheriff and County Board Chair pursuant to authority granted in section 72.08(3)(a) of the Dane County Code of Ordinances. Water levels on Squaw Bay have now dropped to levels that justify reverting to the normal slow-no-wake restrictions.

The County of Dane hereby declares that effective as of sunrise on August $\frac{2}{3}$, 2013, the previously issued Declaration of Emergency Slow-No-Wake Zone on Squaw Bay is rescinded. All surface areas of Lake Monona shall revert to the normal slow-no-wake zone extending 200 feet from the shoreline as set forth in Dane County Code of Ordinances Section 72.08(1)(a).
