

**DECLARATION OF RECISSION
EMERGENCY SLOW-NO-WAKE ZONE
ON LAKES MONONA, WAUBESA AND KEGONSA**

Heavy rainfall in June resulted in high water levels on Lakes Monona, Waubesa and Kegonsa, posing a substantial risk to property and public safety. On June 19, 2018, an Emergency Slow-No-Wake Zone was declared on the entire surface area of the aforementioned lakes. The emergency slow-no-wake zone was declared by the County Executive, Sheriff and County Board Chair pursuant to authority granted in section 72.08(3)(a)1 of the Dane County Code of Ordinances.

The declaration stated that emergency slow-slow-no-wake restrictions would be rescinded when the water levels were at or below the following elevations for 5 consecutive days:


Lake Monona: 846.60
Squaw Bay (Lake Monona): 846.40
Lake Waubesa:846.20
Lake Kegonsa : 844.70


With the exception of Squaw Bay, the water levels of Lakes Monona, Waubesa and Kegonsa have receded to the level that justifies reverting to the normal slow-no-wake restrictions.

The County of Dane hereby declares that effective as of noon on July 10, 2018, the Declaration of Emergency Slow-No-Wake Zone on Lakes Monona, Waubesa and Kegonsa are rescinded. As of that time those lakes are subject to the normal slow-no-wake zone extending 200 feet from the shoreline as established by Dane County Code of Ordinances Section 72.08(1)(a).

The Emergency Slow-No-Wake Zone on Squaw Bay remains in effect until further notice.
